

LABOR FORCE

In 2000, Sheboygan had 26,875 residents, or 68.2% of its population, in the labor force. In March of 2010, Sheboygan County has a total of 63,379 people in the labor force and an unemployment rate of 10.0%.

UTILITIES

WATER & SEWER

The City provides the public water system and sewer. Public water is obtain in Lake Michigan. Wastewater is treated at the Sheboygan Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility, located in the City of Sheboygan.

ELECTRICITY

Provided by Alliant Energy.

NATURAL GAS

Provided by Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPS).

TELECOMMUNICATIONS/CABLE

Landline phone service is provided by AT&T. Charter Communications and AT&T broadband services.

TRANSPORTATION

The City of Sheboygan is located along Interstate-43 and State Highways 23, 28, and 42. Rail access provided by Union Pacific (UP). Sheboygan County Memorial Airport (SBM) is three miles away. Sheboygan is located less than an hour from Milwaukee and Green Bay. Sheboygan is also the only designated Spaceport in the mid-west.

HOUSING

Using 2000 Census data, the median housing value in the City of Sheboygan was \$89,400 and is less than the median value of the entire County.

BUSINESS PARKS

There are two business parks in the City of Sheboygan, both are on the south side. Both business parks are located adjacent to Interstate 43, offering easy access and visibility to the interstate and State Highway 28.

The Sheboygan Business Center is 335 acres and has approximately 56 acres of buildable land remaining, most owned by the City.

The Southside Business Park is a fully developed 200-acre business park. Periodically buildings become available.
