Message From The Chairman

2012 has certainly been a year of fluctuations. Over the year we witnessed a gubernatorial recall, national elections, significant changes in our staff and many wonderful additions to our Board of Directors.

Through all of the recent changes, the SCEDC's outlook continues to grow brighter. By late 2012, our third year of operation, we had already exceeded our five-year strategic goal of catalyzing \$100 million in capital investment and crushed our 2011 job retention/ creation numbers by more than doubling our impact. We have seen the conclusion of the Plymouth-Kohler Railroad, a three year project for the SCEDC, and our list of clients has grown exponentially.

The SCEDC served an active role to increase access to capital by taking over administration of the County Business Loan Fund and helping to create the Lakeshore Angel Network, which will soon be ready to take on its first investments. The SCEDC has continually been asked by companies to help them assemble financial packages with local and state resources to help secure primary financing and offset workforce training.

Despite all these changes, our focus and promise to enhance the economic climate and opportunities in Sheboygan County have remained steadfast. We know there is more to be done.

I would like to thank our investors and Board of Directors for their continued support of our efforts.

While chambers of commerce and the SCEDC often collaborate, each organization employs different strategies to accomplish our overlapping goals in support of a vibrant, expanding business base.



The SCEDC's 2010-2014 Strategic Plan established the following ambitious goals for job creation and new capital investment. Three years into our five-year strategic plan, we've made significant progress. These results are based on our participation in projects for 22 business clients.

CREATE AND RETAIN 3,500 JOBS

The SCEDC has contributed services that helped to create and retain 2,433 jobs since 2010.



SECURE \$100 MILLION IN CAPITAL INVESTMENT

In three years, we already exceeded our five-year strategic plan to secure \$100 million in new capital investments by \$12 million!



2012 Actual Expenses Chart







Success Stories

The SCEDC has been an active participant and partner in supporting local business development activity and success. Over the past three years, in partnership with municipalities and business organizations, the SCEDC has played a direct role in supporting the success of entrepreneurs and major players alike.

American Orthodontics

American Orthodontics is one of the world's largest orthodontics equipment manufacturers and had recently outgrown its facilities. The City of Sheboygan and SCEDC met with the company to discuss their expansion plans, which included an additional facility. At that meeting, it was brought up that the company may want to purchase the 250,000 square-foot "Thomas" Building.

Company officials had not previously considered moving their operations and jumped at the opportunity. Company founder and Chairman of the Board, Dan Merkel, is very pleased with the purchase. "AO's dedicated people have been manufacturing high quality orthodontic products for the past 44 years. We have been committed to growing our world-wide operations in Sheboygan."

Rockline Industries Inc.

When Rockline Industries Inc. secured a contract with a large multinational firm, it announced plans to invest \$10 million in new technology and add up to 60 family-supporting jobs with a 6,000 square-foot expansion of its Sheboygan plant. The City


of Sheboygan, SCEDC, and State of Wisconsin worked with Rockline to provide local and state incentives, including a loan from the City of Sheboygan and the State of Wisconsin. As a result, the company has introduced new equipment to increase its wet wipe manufacturing capabilities.

Following the announcement, Rockline asked the SCEDC to assist with a supplier's relocation to Sheboygan. This effort was unsuccessful due to a lack of available facilities. However, the commercial real estate agent representing the prospect stated: "The Sheboygan County EDC was aggressive and responded more comprehensively than many other economic development agencies I have worked with. They added value to my efforts in attempting to find a suitable Sheboygan-area location."

Glacier Transit and Storage

Glacier Transit and Storage's CFO approached the SCEDC about financial resources that may be available for their new facility in the Plymouth Industrial Development Corporation's Business Park.

After meeting with the company, the SCEDC explained the various programs and the effect they would have financially on the company. The SCEDC recommended the company apply for state economic development tax credits. Together with a local financial package from the City of Plymouth and Plymouth Industrial Development Corporation, the company was able to start the construction of their new 70,000 square-foot cold storage facility.



D&H Sales and Service

Like so many companies in Sheboygan County, D&H Sales and Service was having difficulty obtaining financing for an expansion. The owner contacted the SCEDC not knowing what may be available.

The SCEDC showed the company the available programs for loan guarantees and subordinated debt options. As a result of the information, D&H Sales was able to work with the lender to get the loan they needed to expand their services in Sheboygan County.

Dairy Farmers of America

Dairy Farmers of America (DFA) indicated plans to make equipment upgrades in a 56-year-old facility in Plymouth, or relocate its operations closer to East Coast markets. Planned upgrades were contingent upon receiving local financial assistance for a new production line and employee training. Throughout the process, the SCEDC coordinated all communications between local partners and DFA representatives. The incentive package from the State of Wisconsin and local partners totaled \$1.6 million to induce DFA's \$13.4 million investment in new equipment and retain 357 jobs, with local payroll and benefits estimated at over \$20 million.

According to Christopher J. Girod, Director at Ryan, DFA's tax consulting firm, "This was one of the best efforts I've ever experienced in terms of state and local economic development and government representatives collaboratively working together toward a common goal. The project partners all definitely deserve a round of applause."

Leading Economic Development Efforts

Plymouth to Kohler Freight Rail Reconstruction

In 2012, all agreements to restore freight rail service from Plymouth to Kohler along an elevenmile stretch of railway had been made. The rail service will reconnect five businesses and two industrial parks. The SCEDC, with its partners, raised over \$2.6 million and received over \$17 million in state transportation grants.

Gary Dulmes, Chairman of the Sheboygan County Economic Development Corporation (SCEDC), was very pleased with the announcement and stated, "The SCEDC is extremely pleased to have played a role in the collaborative effort to restore freight rail from Plymouth to Kohler. This project is fantastic for Sheboygan County as it not only creates new jobs, but also offers an additional transportation alternative for local businesses."

The rail line servicing Plymouth to Sheboygan Falls has been out-of-service for over 20 years, while the Kohler to Sheboygan Falls corridor has been discontinued since 2006.

"This project represents the department's multi-modal approach to addressing transportation needs in Wisconsin," said Wisconsin Department of Transportation Secretary Mark Gottlieb. "We are pleased to partner with several businesses, local governments and organizations to move this project forward."

Participating organizations include the SCEDC, Wisconsin and Southern Railroad, Kettle Lake Co-op, Bemis Manufacturing, Morrelle Transfer and Warehouse, Wisconsin DOT, King Structures Inc., Sheboygan County, City of Plymouth and the City of Sheboygan Falls. This project is the first time a freight rail line has been restored in the State of Wisconsin.


Lakeshore Industry Cluster Initiative


